Help us plan for the future

The most important part of making a Will is, of course, ensuring provision for your own family and friends. However, once you have done this, you may wish to consider using your Will to improve the lives of people with a learning disability in the future by leaving a legacy to HFT.

Leaving a gift in your Will to HFT is a very special way of supporting our work. Last year supporters left over £1/2 million in their Wills to HFT which was used to purchase new houses and specialist equipment.

Leaving a gift to HFT is easy to do. You just include it like a gift to an individual; "I give and bequeath to The Home Farm Trust of Merchants House, Wapping Road, Bristol, BS1 4RW. Registered Charity No. 313069 a sum of £... (or a ..% share of my estate), free of duty for the general purpose of the Charity and I direct that a receipt of the Honorary Treasurer or other authorised officer for the time being of the Charity shall be a good and sufficient discharge for my Executors for the payment of the said legacy."

It also often means there is less tax to pay, as gifts to charity are exempt from Inheritance Tax.

There are a number of ways you can remember HFT in your Will

- **Some percentage of the remainder of your estate** after gifts, tax and expenses have been paid, for example a Mrs Davis left 2/5th of her estate to HFT, 1/5th to her disabled son in a discretionary trust and 2/5th to her able son.
- A specific **cash sum**
- **Any or a share of funds left in a discretionary trust** after the death of the person it was primarily set up for.
- Or a **combination** of all these ways

You don't have to be wealthy to leave a legacy and however small your gift may seem to you, it will represent a significant contribution to the lives of people with a learning disability in the future.
